To Willard Maynard Constable of the town

of Sudbury in the County of Middlebury -

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections also all those qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public Meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the fifteenth day of December current at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles:-

1. To bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Representative to the Congress of the United States for District Number four.

2. To Choose a Moderator.

3. To see if the town will appropriate two Dollars ninety four Cents out of any money not otherwise appropriated to pay the Committee chosen to repair Sherman's and Parbury Bridges a balance due them it being for an error in the settlement of their accounts.

4. To see if the town will take any measures for making a Road laid out on the petition of Luther Goodnow and others to do or act on this article as the town shall think best when met.
