

December 9. 1834.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury  
held qualified to vote in Elections (also all those qualified  
to vote in town affairs) held on Monday the fifteenth  
day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and thirty four for the purpose of giving in  
their votes for a Representative of this Commonwealth in  
the Congress of the United States for District Number four.  
The whole number of votes given in were sorted, counted,  
revised, and declaration thereof made, as by law is directed  
and were for the following persons:

For Samuel Hoar twenty two votes  
" Herman Lincoln thirty four votes  
" James Russell Esq. nineteen votes

2. Then chose Col. Dwight Fairbank Moderator.

3. Voted to appropriate two Dollars ninety four Cents out  
of any money now in the Treasury not otherwise  
appropriated to pay the Committee chosen to  
repair Sherman's & Panty Bridges a Balance  
due them for an error in the settlement of  
their account.

4. Voted to choose a Committee of two to look out the making of  
the Road located on the Petition of Luther Goodnow and  
others. Then chose Levi Smith & Capt. Cutting.  
Then voted that this meeting be dissolved.
