19. To see if the town will choose a committee to ascertain whether there is any property wood or land belonging to the town that can be disposed of.
20. To see if the town will recommend to their Selectmen not to approbate any one to retail spirit in town the present year.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
