At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of
Sudbury, held on Monday the 6th day of April A.D.
1835 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken
up and acted upon in the following manner—

1. Chose John Hunk moderator.
2. Chose Capt. Wm. Brigham Town Treasurer.

Then voted to take up the 3rd article, then voted to pass over this
article for the present.

4. Voted to audit of the settlement of the selectmen with
the town treasurer and ordered the same to be recorded,
which is as follows.

We the Selectmen hereby report that they have settled with
the Treasurer and find his account stands as follows

Balance on hand from last year's settlement	\$38.02
Balance on the grants of 1834 due the town on this year's settlement	297.22

We also find in the treasury, ninety six Dollars collected from the state for the Soldiers	96.00
Which sum is left for the following purposes	\$431.24

For Summer Schools	\$200.—
For Discounts	30.00
Not taken up on the Poor Grant	47.55
	\$277.55

Which leave a balance now in the treasury not designed
for any particular purpose of ——— \$153.69

Parish Grant	\$412.91
Surplus on said grant	18.02
due on last year's settlement	7.29
	\$438.22

Of which sum the treasurer
has paid ——— \$438.22
