Sudbury in the County of Middlesex — Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the 20th day of April instant at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles.

1. To Choose a Moderator.

2. To see if the town will take any measures to repair the several schoolhouses in town, or build them anew, with or without an additional number, or build a new one in the Centre District with a townhouse in connection or without a townhouse in connection, or at any other way respecting schoolhouses & townhouse as the town shall think proper.

3. To see if the town will give liberty to pasture the Burying Ground the present year.

4. To see if the town will direct the town Clerk to purchase a Book for Town Records.

5. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered.

6. To see what measures the town will take to make the road located by the Selectmen on the petition of Ephraim Moore and others.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting-house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.
