1835 To Daniel W. Moore Constable of the town of Sudbury in
the County of Middlesex — Greeting.

1835 In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified
to vote in elections, also all those qualified to vote in town affairs
to meet at the public Meetinghouse in said Sudbury on Monday
the fourth day of May next at one o'clock in the afternoon
then and there to act on the following articles:

1. To bring in to the Selectmen their votes for three County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex on one Ballot, from different towns in said County; and to bring in their votes for two Special Commissioners for said County on one Ballot from different towns in said County.
2. To choose a Moderator.
3. To see if the town will build three new schoolhouses and move one or more of the old ones or do or act any way respecting Schoolhouses as the town shall think proper.
4. To see if the town will grant money to build three new schoolhouses and to repair the old ones.
5. To see if the town will make any addition to or repair their house on the pauper farm and grant money for the same or act any way respecting said house that the town may think proper.
6. To see if the town will sell a piece of land from their pauper farm to straighten a line: and act any way on this article that the town may think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meetinghouse in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting. Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
