I served the within warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said town two Sabbaths before the time of holding this meeting.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the fourth day of May D. 1835 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner.

1. Gave in their votes for three County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex and they were for the following persons

Caleb Butler of Groton thirty three votes

John Wade of Woburn thirty eight votes

Stephen Pope of Marlborough forty five votes

Abner Wheeler of Framingham twenty votes

Lemuel Parker of South Reading sixteen votes

David Townsend of Waltham nine votes

Joshua Prescott of Reading twenty five votes

Joseph Butterfield of Tingsborough nineteen votes

Luke Fisk of Waltham sixteen votes

Timothy Prescott of Concord six votes

For Special Commissioners

William Livingston of Lowell twenty five votes

Timothy Prescott of Concord thirty nine votes

Nathaniel Austin of Charlestown two votes

M. M. Butler of Wayland two votes

Joseph Butterfield of Tingsborough one vote

David Townsend of Waltham one vote

Samuel Brooks of Brighton thirteen votes

Abner Wheeler of Framingham one vote.

2. Chose John Hunt Moderator.

3. Voted to pass over this article.

4. Granted seven hundred and fifty Dollars to repair the five school-houses in town. Then granted twenty five Dollars to repair the small schoolhouse in the west part of the town. Carried forward
