Then voted that this meeting be dissolved.

To Daniel W. Moore Constable of the town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the public Meeting house in said town on Monday the first day of June next at three o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles:—

1. To bring in to the Selectmen their votes for two County Commissioners on one ballot being inhabitants of different towns in said County and also for one Special County Commissioner.

2. To choose a Moderator.

3. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
