Middlesex Co. To Daniel H. Moore Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County

Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house in said town on Monday the thirtyfirst instant at four o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator.

2. To see if the town will give Luther Goodnow liberty to move the Centre School-house to some other place on the Common that the town may think proper, provided he will move said house at his own expense, or act any way on this article as the town may think proper.

3. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meeting-house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
