L.S. Middlesex Co. To Daniel W. Moore Constable of the town of Sudbury
 L.S. in the County of Middlesex Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to
 notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to
 vote in elections to meet at the public Meetinghouse in said Sudbury
 on Monday the ninth day of November, next being the second Monday
 of said month at twelve o'clock Meridian.

To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Governor and Lieutenant
 Governor of this Commonwealth and for five Senators on one Ballot for
 the District of Middlesex for the year ensuing—

And to choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court
 to be holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an
 attested Copy thereof at the public Meetinghouse in said town
 two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings
 thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.

 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
