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To Daniel W. More Constable of the town of
Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections & in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the seventh day of March next at twelve o'clock Meridian there and there to act on the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
3. To bring in their votes for a Register of Deeds for the County of Middlesex.
4. To determine the manner of repairing their highways town ways and bridges the year ensuing and to grant a suitable sum of money for the same.
5. To see what measures the town will take to collect the Taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of the town the present year and to agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
6. To see if the town will choose a Committee to examine and adjust all accounts that may be brought against the town and allow the same if reasonable.
7. To hear and act on the Report of the Ministerial Fund Corporation.
8. To hear and act on all reports of Committees that may be offered. and to appropriate money to pay the balance due the schoolhouse Committee and the Committee chosen to carry on the lawsuit with William Hunt 3rd.
9. To see if the town will take any measures to repair or rebuild the bridge near Adam Howes and repair the Canal Bridge or act any way on this article as the town shall think proper.
