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10. To see if the town will give their Overseer of the Poor any discretionary power with respect to obtaining an overseer on their poor farm, to him for one or more years or let the farm with the Poor, or act any way on this article as the town shall think proper.

11. To see if the town will discount certain taxes that may be offered to be discounted.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid Given under our hands and seals this twenty seventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six
