12.5/ Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house in said town on Monday the thirtieth day of May current at two o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles, viz.

1. To Choose a Moderator.
2. To see if the town will accept of the Settlement of the Selectmen with the town Treasurer and order the same to be recorded.
3. To Choose a man from the Centre District to fill the vacancy in the school Committee.
4. To grant money to pay Col. Ephraim Moore for making a road from the County road to his house - and to grant money to pay for making the road laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Col. Ephraim Moore & others.
5. To appropriate the money received from the State school fund.
6. To see if the town will discount certain taxes to the Collector.
7. To see if the town will accept of an alteration in a road made by the Selectmen on the Petition of Joel Moore & others.
8. To see if the town will accept of a road altered by the Selectmen on the Petition of Levi Smith & others.
9. To hear & act on all reports of Committees that may be offered.
10. To see if the town will give liberty to Elisha F. Jones to build a dry Bridge across the road near Mr. Jeduthan Willis.
11. To see what measures the town will take relative to an indictment found against the town on a complaint made by Joseph Rice on account of the road being out of repair in the south part of the town.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.
