L.S. / Middlesex ss. To Daniel W. Moore Constable of the town of
 L.S. / Sudbury in the County of Middlesex — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the thirtyfirst day of Oct. current at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles:

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To see what measures the town will take to oppose the location of a new road through the north part of the town as prayed for in the petition of C. C. Damon and others.
3. To see if the town will accept of a road laid out by the Selectmen near Iron Works Causeway on the petition of Levi Smith and others.
4. To see if the town will take any measures to obtain the property belonging to James Goodnow.
5. To see if the town will discount to Isaac Parmenter his highway tax.
6. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered; & to hear the report of the Selectmen respecting Guide-boards and act thereon.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doing thereon to the town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
