Pursuant to the within warrant I have notified the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury herein described to meet at said time and place and for the purposes within mentioned by posting up an attested copy of this warrant at the public meeting-house in said town two Sabbath, before the time set for said meeting. At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the thirty first day of Oct. A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty six the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner.

1. Chose William Brigham moderator.
2. Voted that the Selectmen be appointed agents to oppose before the County Commissioners the location of the road petitioned for by C. C. Cannon and others.
3. Voted to accept of a road as laid out by the Selectmen as follows. On the petition of Levi Smith and others, we the subscribers Selectmen of the town of Sudbury have laid out and widened the road for the use of the town the road leading from the Iron work Causeway to Joel Belcom as follows: Beginning at a Stake & Stones near the Stone Shire at the west end of said Causeway at land of Lewis Brigham then through said Brigham's land northwardly thru and a half rods to a stake and Stones, then still northwardly three rods to a Stake & Stones, then northwardly ten rods to a Stake and Stones at the old wall near the Stone Shire. also have widened on the westerly side of the old road beginning at a walnut stub in the fence at land of Henry Vose then through said Vose's land northwardly six rods to a maple tree, then northwardly six rods to a black Oak, then northwardly three and a half rods to a white Oak in the fence at the old road.
