[L.S.] To Daniel H. Moore Constable of the town of
Sudbury in the County of Middlesex, for rating.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and in town affairs to meet at the public Meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the sixth day of March next at twelve o'clock Meridian there and there to act on the following articles (viz.)

1. To bring in to the Selectmen their written votes for a County Commissioner to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of David Townsend Esq. for the residue of the term for which said Townsend was chosen.
2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
3. To bring in their vote for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
4. To determine the manner of repairing their highways town-ways & bridges the year ensuing and to grant a suitable sum of money for the same.
5. To see what measures the town will take to collect the Taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of the town the present year and to agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
6. To see if the town will choose a Committee on Accounts.
7. To see if the town will discount to the Collector certain Taxes that he may offer to be discounted.
8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen or town Treasurer to receive the town's proportion of the Surplus Revenue of the United States that may become due before the first of April and discharge so much of the town's debt for the Poor Establishment.
9. To see if the town will call on the Treasurer and ask him to show cause if any he can why the Settlement of 1836 was not correct and at any way respecting said Settlement the town may think best where met.
10. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered and appropriate money is necessary.
