L.S. Middlebury. To Daniel M. Moore Constable of the town of Sudbury in
L.S. the County of Middlesex

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to
notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in
elections also all those qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the
public meeting-house in said town on Monday the third day of April
next at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following
articles viz.

1. To bring in to the Selectmen their written votes for a County Com-
missioner to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of David
Townsend Esq. for the residue of the term for which said Townsend
was Chosen.
2. To Choose a Moderator.
3. To Choose a town Treasurer & Constable and fill all vacancies
in the town offices.
4. To act on the 5th & 7th articles in the warrant for March meeting
which were put over to April meeting.
5. To see if the town will accept of the settlement of the Selectmen with
the town Treasurer and order the same to be recorded.
6. To grant money for the summer and winter schools and order
how the same shall be distributed.
7. To grant money for the support of the Poor the present year.
8. To grant money to pay the assessors the present year.
9. To grant money to pay the town Treasurer the present year.
10. To grant money to pay amounts allowed by the Committee on
accounts.
11. To see if the town will accept of a List of Jurors as made out by
the Selectmen.
12. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered.
13. To see if the town will appoint some person to ring the bell for
town meetings and act as Sexton the present year.
14. To see if the town will authorize the town Treasurer to receive this towns
proportion of the Surplus Revenue of the United States whenever it
may become payable.
