Granted two hundred & fifteen Dollars for Summer Schools to be distributed in the same manner as last year viz. two hundred Dollars to be equally divided among the five school Districts & fifteen Dollars for the small school house in the west part of the town. Then granted four hundred Dollars for the Winter schools to be equally divided among the five school Districts - Then granted seventy five Dollars for Wood to be equally divided among the five school Districts.
7. Granted for the support of the Poor five hundred Dollars.
8. Granted to pay the Holfsons twenty Dollars.
9. Granted to pay the Treasurer ten Dollars.
