In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified
to vote in elections to meet at the public meeting house in said
Sudbury on Monday the thirtieth day of November current being
the second Monday of said month at twelve o'clock Meridian,
To bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor and
Lieut. Governor of this Commonwealth and for five Senators on
one ballot for the District of Middlesex for the year ensuing.
And to choose a Representative to represent them in the
General Court of this Commonwealth ~~and for five Senators~~
to be convened and holden at Boston on the first Wednesday
of January next. And you are directed to serve this warrant
by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting
house in said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the time for
holding said meeting. Hereof fail not and make return
of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the
time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
