L.S. Middlesex ss. To Daniel W. Moore Constable of the town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex

Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the thirtieth day of November current at two o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles.

1. To Choose a Moderator.

2. To see what measures the town will take to make the road located on the petition of Edwin C. Damon & others agreeable to an order of notice from the County Commissioners.

3. To see if the town will vote to build a Barn on the Poor Establishment and take any measures for that purpose the town may think proper.

4. To see if the town will appropriate the money assessed upon the American Powder Company & their tenants for public schools to the school in Acton near said Company's Works to enable said Company and tenants to send their children to said school in Acton.

5. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may be offered.

6. To see if the town will appropriate three Dollars forty seven Cents out of any unappropriated money now in the treasury to pay an outstanding Order.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
