Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet at the public Meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the fifth day of March next at twelve o'clock A.M. and then to act on the following Articles, viz,

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
3. To determine the manner of repairing their highways, town ways and bridges the year ensuing, and grant as suitable sum of money for the same.
4. To see what measures the town will take to collect the taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of the town the present year, and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
5. To see if the town will choose a committee on accounts.
6. To hear and act on all reports of Committees that may be offered.
7. To see if the town will appropriate money out of any unappropriated money now in the treasury to pay Henry Rose & Lewis Brigham for land taken for a road.
8. To see if the town will take any measures to build one or more new schoolhouses, to do or act any way on this article as the town may think proper.
9. To see if the town will take any measures to secure their title to a certain piece of land on Lake's End Hill so called; to do or act any way on this article as the town may think proper.
10. To see if the town will take any measures to have a Post Office established in the centre of the Town, and
