

April 1838-

1. At a legal Meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified by the Constitution to vote in Elections, and in town affairs held on ^{mon day} the second day of April A.D. 1838. The Inhabitants aforesaid gave in their votes for three County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex, and the same being sorted and counted in said meeting by the selectmen, were for the following persons.

Caleb Butler of Groton had one hundred and twenty one votes

Abner Wheeler of Framming one hundred and twenty one votes

Timothy Fletcher, Charlestown one hundred and twenty one votes

Tyler Bigelow, Watertown forty six votes

Isaac Fuller of Newton forty seven votes

William Livingston Lowell forty seven votes

Stewart J. Park of Groton one vote

Simon Thompson Tingsboro' one vote

John Clark Watertown one vote

Whole number of ballots one hundred and sixty nine

Then the said Inhabitants gave in their votes for two Special Commissioners which being sorted & counted in manner aforesaid were for the following persons

Timothy Prescott of Concord had one hundred and two votes

William Livingston of Lowell, eighty votes

Lilley Eaton of Reading fifty one votes

Warren Nixon, Frammingham fifty one votes

Paul Gerrish, Townsend, seventeen votes
