At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of Sudbury legally qualified to vote in town affairs held on Monday the 16.th day of April A. D. 1838. the preceding warrant was acted upon in the following manner -

1. Chose Col. Dury Fairbanks moderator,
2. Voted to pass over the 9.th Article in the warning of March meeting, which was put over to this meeting. And the 4.th Article in the warning of the meeting held on the 2^d inst. was acted upon under the ninth 9.th Article in the warning of this meeting. Voted to pass over the 6.th & 7.th Articles in the warning of the meeting April 2^d. which were put over to this meeting -
3. Voted to accept of the settlement of the Selectmen with the Treasurer, and ordered the same to be recorded -
