At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote for Representatives to the General Court, held in said Town, on Monday the seventh day of May A.D. 1838. The inhabitants aforesaid gave in their votes for two County Commissioners, and one Special Commissioner, which, being sorted and counted by the Selectmen, and declaration thereof being made in said meeting, were as follows, To wit:-
