At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote for Representatives to the General Court, held in said Town on Monday the Eleventh day of June AD 1838. — The inhabitants gave in their votes for two County Commissioners, and one special Commissioner, which being set out and counted by the selectmen, and declaration thereof being made in said meeting, were as follows, to wit,

1. For County Commissioners

Caleb Butler of Groton had fifty three votes

Abner Wheeler of Framingham fifty four votes

Joel Fuller of Newton forty votes

Jesse Fox of Lowell thirty nine votes

Whole number of ballots for County Commissioners one hundred and eighty six —

For Special Commissioner

William Livingston of Lowell had three votes

Warren Nixon of Framingham thirty seven votes

Lilly Eaton of Reading thirty six votes

Whole number of ballots for Special Commissioner seventy six

Town Clerk being absent Charles Stearns was chosen Town Clerk pro tem.

Art. 2. Chose Drury Faubank Moderator.

Art. 3. Voted to pass over this article. —

Voted to dissolve said meeting
