To Daniel M. Moore Constable
of the Town of Sudbury in said County - Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and
warn the Inhabitants of said Town qualified to vote
for representatives to the General Court, to meet at the
Public Meetinghouse in said Town, on Monday the
twentieth day of August instant at three o'clock P.M.
then and there to act on the following Articles viz.

1. To give in to the Selectmen their written votes for
one Special County Commissioner.
2. To Choose a moderator.
3. To see if the town will discount certain taxes
that may be offered for that purpose -

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting
up an attested copy thereof at the public meetinghouse
in said Sudbury, two sabbaths at least before the time
for holding said meeting.

If you fail not and make due return of this warrant
with your doing, thereon, to the Selectmen at the time
and place aforesaid.
