To Daniel W. Moore Constable
of the Town of Sudbury in said County: Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts you are hereby required to notify
and warn the inhabitants of said Town qualified to
vote for representatives to the General Court, to meet at the
public meeting house in said Town, on Monday the
twelfth day of November instant at twelve o'clock P. M.
then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

1. To Bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor, &
Lieut Governor of this Commonwealth - And for five
Senators on one ballot for the District of Middlesex for the
ensuing year - And also to choose one or more Represent-
atives to represent said town in the General Court of this
Commonwealth to be convened and holden on the first
Wednesday of January next - And likewise to give in
their votes for a representative of said Commonwealth in
the Congress of the United States for District Number four
2. To Choose a moderator
3. To see if the town will accept of a highway laid out by
the Selectmen on the petition of John Brown and others.
4. To see if the Town will accept of a highway laid out
by the Selectmen on the petition Beriah Oaks and others.
5. To see if the Town will accept of a highway laid out
by the Selectmen on the petition of Noah Smith and
two others.
6. To hear and act upon reports of Committees if any
are offered
7. To see if the Town will authorize the overseers of the poor
to build a shed adjoining to the new barn on the poor farm
and remove the Cider-Mill-house - to do or act as the
town may think proper
8. To see if the town will compensate Mr. Obadiah Perry for land
taken for a road, and for fencing on said road -
