At a Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, legally warned, held on Monday the first day of April A. D. 1839 - the Articles in the preceding warrant were acted upon in the following manner, viz, -

1. Said Inhabitants gave in their votes to the selectmen for a representative of the Commonwealth, in the Congress of the United States, for District Number four - as follows -

Whole number of ballots given in was -

Two hundred & forty six

For the Hon. William Parmenter of Cambridge -
one hundred & fifty five votes

For the Hon. Nathan Brooks of Concord
Eighty two votes

For Frederick Robinson of Charlestown
nine votes -

For Hon. John Heyes Concord
one vote

For James J. Woodbury Acton,
one vote

1. Article chose Col. D. Fairbank Moderator

2. Gave in their votes for County Treasurer as follows - viz

For Stedman Buttrick, Esq. Concord, one hundred and forty two - votes -

For Abner H. Nelson Esq, Concord, Forty Votes

Voted to take up the 19th Article, and also Voted to pass it over -

3^d Art. Voted to grant five hundred dollars for the Support of the Poor.

4.th Granted fifty ^{five} dollars and sixty cents to pay amounts allowed by Comm^{rs} on Accounts -
