In the name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts, You are hereby Ordered to notify
and warn the inhabitants of said Town qual-
-ified to vote in Elections, to meet at the meetinghouse
of the First Parish in said Town on Monday the Eleventh day
of November next, it being the second Monday of said month,
at twelve o'clock meridian to give in to the Selectmen their
written votes for Governor & Lieutenant Governor of said Com-
-monwealth, and five Senators for the district of Middlesex and
also for one or more representatives to represent said Town in
the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened and
held at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next—
Polls for election of said officers to be opened at one o'clock
P. M. —

And You are also directed to warn the inhab-
itants of said Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs
to meet at the time and place aforesaid, to act on the follow-
-ing Articles viz. —

1. To choose a moderator
2. To see if the town will choose an agent or agents to meet
the Commissioners at the next session at Cambridge, in relation
to the road to be located on the Petition of Albin Parmente and
others, in case the town shall be notified for that Purpose —
3. To see if the town will compensate Mr Obadiah Perry for
fencing on the road lately located through his land —
4. To hear and act on all reports of committees
5. To see if the town will allow Webster Moor's Account for
taking care of Grosvenor Davis, a pauper,
6. To see if the town will discount certain taxes that may
be offered for that purpose —
