To Nahum Goodnow Junr. Constable
of the Town of Sudbury in said County
Creeting—

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, You are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote for Senators & Representatives to the General Court, to meet at the meeting house of the first Parish in said town, on Monday the sixth day of April next at twelve o'clock, Meridian, To give in to the selectmen their written votes, year or nay, to a proposed amendment of the Constitution— And you are also directed to warn the inhabitants of said Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the time and place, to act on the following Articles—

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March meeting—
3. To see if the town will accept of a list of Junors as made out by the selectmen
4. To grant a suitable sum of money for the support of the poor the ensuing year—
5. To grant money to pay accounts allowed by the Committee on accounts
6. To Grant money for the support of the Winter & Summer schools, and order how the same shall be distributed
7. To Grant money to pay, The Treasurer & Assessors,
8. To hear and act on all reports of Committees—
9. To grant money for incidental expenses
10. To see if the town will grant a sum of money to defray the expense of repairing the north road as ordered by the C. Commissioners—
11. To see if the town will grant money for making the road laid out by the C. Commissioners on the petition
