— And likewise to choose a representative to represent
to represent said Town in the General Court of the Com-
monwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of
January next — And to bring their votes for Electors
of President & Vice President of the United States — Polls to
be opened at one o'clock —

And you are furthermore required to notify the
inhabitants of said Sudbury qualified to vote in Town
affairs to meet at the above named time and place
for the following purposes — Viz

1. To choose a moderator
- 2^d To choose a Committee to let out the making of the
road located on the Petition to James Moore and Others —
- 3^d To see if the Town will accept of a road laid out by the
Selectmen on the petition of Reuben Hunt and others & choose a
a committee to let out the making of said road if accepted
- 4th To see if the Town will accept of a road laid out by the
Selectmen on the petition of Asa Smith and others and relinquish
the Town's right in the old road for the right in the new one
- 5th To hear, and on the reports of Committees —
- 6th To see if the Town will discount certain taxes if offered
- 7th To see if the Town will choose an Agent or Agents to
oppose the alterations in the road between C. Hunt's Store and
Pantry bridge as prayed for in the petition of Enoch Redden & others

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting
by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in
said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting
And if fail not and make return of this warrant with your
doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid
