

April 1841

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the fifth day of April A. D. 1841 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner.

1. Gave in their votes for three County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex and they were for the following persons

Timothy Fletcher of Charlestown one hundred and eighteen.

Leonard N. Parker of Shirley one hundred votes

Letta Davis of Newton one hundred votes

Asa F. Lawrence of Pepperell eighteen votes

Oliver M. Whipple of Lowell eighteen votes

Whole number of votes one hundred and eighteen

For Special Commissioners

Timothy Prescott of Concord one hundred votes

George W. Pike of Stoneham one hundred votes

Chester Adams of Natick eighteen votes

Darius Stevens of Stoneham eighteen votes

Whole number of votes one hundred and eighteen

2. Chose Abel B. Jones Moderator.

3. Col. Quincy Fairbank Excused from serving as High way surveyor and chose Asa Jones, Levi Parmenter Jun. excused from serving as School Committee and chose Eddy Fairbank chose Thomas Stearns Jun. Constable who engages to collect the taxes at one & one quarter per cent and all other town business usually done by the Constable.

4. Granted five hundred dollars ^{for} the support of Poor

5. Granted four hundred and sixty Dollars including fuel for the Winter schools and two hundred Dollars for Summer schools distributed equally among the five Districts.
