To Thomas Stearns Jun. Constable of the town of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting
In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the third day of May next at two o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following article

To bring in To the Selectmen their written votes on one ticket for two County Commissioners being inhabitants of different towns in said County and also for one Special County Commissioner.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the Meetinghouse aforesaid two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.

Given under our hands and seals this 20th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one.
