L.S. To Thomas Stearns Jun. Constable of the town of
L.S. Sudbury in said County Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in Sudbury on Monday, the eighth day of November next at eleven o'clock in the forenoon it being the second Monday of said month. To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Governor & Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth, and six Senators for the district of Middlesex all on one ballot. And also to choose representative to represent them in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened and holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of Jan. next.

Polls to be opened at twelve o'clock Meridian.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the meeting house aforesaid two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
