L. S. In the name of the Commonwealth of Massa-

-chusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the sixth day of December next at one o'clock P.M. there and there to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator.

2nd To see if the town will straighten widen and repair the Road by Henry Voses to the Meetinghouse to do or act as the Town shall think proper.

3rd To see if the town will build a town house or provide a suitable place for holding their meetings in future to do or act as the town shall think proper.

4th To discount certain taxes that may be offered for that purpose.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the Meetinghouse aforesaid two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not, and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
