In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the seventh day of March next at twelve o'clock at noon, there and there to act on the following articles, viz:

1. To Choose a Moderator.
2. To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
3. To Choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
4. To determine the manner of repairing highways and bridges the <sup>year</sup> ensuing and grant money for the same.
5. To hear and act on all reports.
6. To see if the town will make an alteration in the manner of warning their town Meetings in future and provide some suitable place for holding the same, to or act, as the town shall think proper.
7. To see if the town will make an alteration in the time and manner of collecting the taxes that may be assessed against the inhabitants of said town the present year, to do or act as the town shall think proper.
8. To see if the town will accept of a Road laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Levi Smith, and also to discontinue a certain piece of old Road near said new way.
9. To see if the town will direct the Treasurer to pay Joel Parmenter the damages allowed by the Selectmen
