L.S. To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town
L.S. of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting
L.S.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Vestry of the Orthodox Meetinghouse in said town on Monday the Eighth day of August next at three o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles viz:

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To see if the town will choose a committee to oppose before the County Commissioners the Road petitioned for by Asa Smith & others.
3. To see if the town will choose a committee to meet the County Commissioners at their meeting to straighten & widen the Road on the petition of Noyes Smith & others, and also to choose a committee to meet said Commissioners at their meeting to straighten & widen the Road on the petition of Horace Heard & others.
4. To see if the town will compensate Luther Richardson for damages sustained by him in consequence of his horse being wounded in the Highway in April last to do or act as the town shall think proper.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each meeting house in said town, fourteen days at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk, on or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
