To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the fourteenth day of November next it being the second Monday of said month at ten o'clock in the forenoon to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor and Lieutenant Governor of this Commonwealth and six Senators for the District of Middlesex all on one ballot And at the same time on a separate ballot their votes for a Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District Number four And also at the same time on a separate ballot their votes for a Representative to represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened and holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next And likewise to bring their written votes for a Special County Commissioner for the County of Middlesex to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Timothy Prescott Esq. for the residue of the term for which the said Prescott was chosen.

Polls will be opened precisely at eleven o'clock.
