In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the fifteenth day of May next at three o'clock in the afternoon, there and there to act on the following articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator
2. To see if the town will choose a Committee to oppose before the County Commissioners the Road petitioned for by William H. Knight & others.
3. To see if the town will place monuments at the most important angles in the Roads lately laid out by the County Commissioners as recommended by said Commissioners.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each Public Meeting house in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not, and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to town Clerk on or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
