In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of
Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at
the Meeting house of the first Parish in said town on
Monday the ninth day of October next at two o'clock
P.M. then and there to act on the following articles viz:

- 1 To choose a Moderator
- 2 To see if the town will accept of a Road laid out
by the Selectmen on the petition of Charles Haynes
- 3 To see if the town will accept of a Road laid out
by the Selectmen on the petition of James P.
Willis & others
- 4 To see if the town will choose a Committee to let
out the making of the Road located by the County
Commissioners on the petition of Levi Smith &
others
- 5 To see if the town will choose a Committee to
oppose before the County Commissioners the Road
petitioned for by Asa Smith & others.
- 6 To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to
withhold all orders to pay for making Roads until
a certificate is received from the several Committees
that the road has been made according to the
terms of letting out, to do or act as the town
shall think best when met

And you are directed to serve this warrant
by posting up an attested copy thereof at each
public Meeting house in said town fourteen days
at least before the time for holding said
meeting.
