Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the
town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and town affairs
to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish in said
town on Monday the thirtieth day of November next it
being the second Monday of said Month at ten o'clock in
the forenoon to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for
a Governor and Lieutenant Governor of this Commonwealth
and six Senators for the District of Middlesex all on one
Ballot And also at the same time on a separate bal-
lot their votes for a Representative to represent said
town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to
be convened and holden at Boston on the first
Wednesday of January next
Polls will be opened precisely at eleven o'clock

And further to act on the following articles viz:

1. To choose a Moderator
2. To hear and act on the report of the Selectmen
on the petition of Charles Haynes for a town way
which was put over to a November Meeting
3. To see if the town will accept of a Road laid
out by the Selectmen on the petition of William
Brigham & others
4. To see if the town cause stone monuments to be
placed at the angles of the Roads laid out by the
County Commissioners, as recommended by Said
Commissioners.
5. To hear and act on all reports.
