town of Sudbury in said County, Greeting,

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the twenty second day of January inst at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles, viz:

1st To choose a Moderator

2nd To see if the town will new School District and build one or more new school houses in said town, and remove one or more of the old ones, to do or act on the subject of Schools as the town shall think best when met.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each public Meeting house in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Whereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk on or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
