To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town
of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town
affairs to meet at the Meeting house of the first
Parish in said town on Monday the fourth day of
March next at Nine O'clock in the forenoon then and
there to act on the following articles viz:

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer.
- 3^d To Choose all necessary town Officers for the year
ensuing.
- 4th To determine the manner of repairing the highways, town
ways, and bridges, the year ensuing and grant money
for the same.
- 5th To hear and act on all reports.
- 6th To choose a Committee to let out the making of the Road
laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Charles Haynes,
and also to choose a Committee to let out the Road laid
out by the Selectmen on petition of W^m Brigham & others.
- 7th To choose a Committee to let out the making of the Road
located by the County Commissioners on petition of
Asa Smith & others.
- 8th To see if the town will discount certain Taxes which
may be offered.
- 9th To see if the town will take any measures to repair the
wash bridge to do or act any other way on the article as
the town shall think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up
an attested copy thereof at each public Meetinghouse in
said town fourteen days at least before the time for hold-
ing said meeting.
