

March 1844

At a legal town meeting held at Sudbury on the 4th day of March A. D. 1844 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows, viz.

- 1 Chose William Brigham Moderator
- 2 Gave in their votes for County Treasurer as follows viz. whole number of votes one hundred and forty one votes for Steadman Buttrick one hundred and forty one votes
- 3 Chose Ephraim⁺ Stone Town Clerk who was qualified in open town Meeting by Lyman Howe Esq.

Selectmen - Ephraim⁺ Moore John⁺ Jones & Reuben⁺ Haynes
Then Voted to adjourn this Meeting to Tuesday the fifth inst. at ten O'clock A. M. to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish

Tuesday March the fifth met according to adjournment then Voted to adjourn to the Vestry of the Orthodox Meeting house forthwith - Met agreeable to the foregoing adjournment and chose for Assessors Buckley Howe, Levi⁺ Dow and Silas⁺ Conant - then Voted that the Selectmen be Overseers of the Poor - Voted to reconsider the last vote and chose for Overseers of the Poor Nahum Thompson Enoch Kidder and Abel B. Jones - Treasurer Nahum Thompson. Voted to put over the choice of Constable & Collector to April Meeting
