of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex — — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the first day of April next at one o'clock in the afternoon

1st To bring in to the Selectmen their written votes on one ticket for three County Commissioners being inhabitants of different towns in said County: And also for two Special County Commissioners

2^d To Choose a Moderator

3^d To Choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March meeting

4th To Grant Money for the Support of the Poor the present year.

5th To Grant Money for the Summer and Winter schools and order how the same shall be distributed and when expended

6th To Grant Money to pay accounts allowed by the Committee on accounts

7th To Grant Money to pay Treasurer and Assessors

8th To Grant Money for incidental expenses

9th To hear and act on all Reports

10th To take further action on the eighth article in the warrant for March Meeting which was put over to April Meeting

11th To Grant Money to pay for Making a Road laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Charles Haynes and to pay damages for the same. Also to pay for Making a Road laid by the County Commissioners on petition of Asa Smith and others

12th To Grant Money to pay damages for a Road laid out by the Selectmen on petition of W^m Brigham and others

13th To Grant Money to pay for the Poorhouse or to do or act on this article as the town shall think best

14th To see what measures the town will take towards providing a place for calling their ^{meetings} for the year ensuing to do or act as they think best
