In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote for Representatives to the General Court to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish on Monday the twenty-ninth day of April current at two O'clock in the after noon.

1st To bring in to the Selectmen their written votes on one ticket for two Special County Commissioners being inhabitants of different towns in said County.

2^d To choose a Moderator

3^d To see if the town will discontinue a town way from the Worcester Road near the house of Edward H. Gibbs to the Graves place to do or act on this article as they shall think best.

4th To see if the town will take further action in referance to Amos Conants account put over to this Meeting

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each public Meetinghouse in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time of Meeting aforesaid.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk on or before the time of Meeting aforesaid.
