At a legal Meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the 23^d day of December A. 1844. Said inhabitants gave in their votes for a Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District Number Four. - and were for the following persons viz.

Whole number of Ballots two hundred fourteen
 William Parmenter one hundred forty
 Benjamin Thompson seventy four

The articles in the preceeding warrant were then taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz.

- 1st Chose Capt. William Brigham Moderator
 - 2^d A Report of the Selectmen in favour of making widening and straightening in the Road on petition of Timothy Johnson & others was presented. - Voted not to except of said Report
 - 3^d Voted to Pass over
- Then Voted to dissolve this Meeting
