In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the third day of March next at ten O'clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator
- 2^d To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer.
- 3^d To Choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing
- 4th To determine the manner of repairing the highways, townways and Bridges the year ensuing and grant Money for the same.
- 5th To hear and act on all Reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each public Meetinghouse in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and Make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of Meeting aforesaid.
