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To Asahel Balcom Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the seventh day of April next at 10 O'clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To choose a Moderator
- 2^d To choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March Meeting
- 3^d To act on the 4th Article in the warrant for March Meeting put over to April Meeting
- 4th To Grant a suitable sum of money for the support of the Poor the ensuing year.
- 5th To Grant money for Summer and Winter Schools and order how the same shall be distributed and when expended.
- 6th To Grant Money to pay accounts allowed by the Committee on accounts.
- 7th To Grant money to pay the Treasurer and Assessors.
- 8th To Grant money for Incidental expenses.
- 9th To hear and act on all Reports
- 10th To see if the Town will so alter the limits of the Highway wards at the north part of the town as to make an additional ward to do or act as they shall think best
- 11th To see if the Town will give liberty to certain individuals to draw the money they pay for the support of schools, to enable them to have a school in the westerly part of the town to do or act as they shall think best
- 12th To see if the town will give Eliza W. Haynes liberty to build a Tomb on the north side of the Road opposite the burying ground
- 13th To see if the town will discount certain Taxes that may be offered
- 14th To see if the town will accept of a Road laid out by the Selectmen as a Town Road on the petition of Sewell Hunt - and to grant a suitable sum of money for damages and making said Road.
