At a legal town Meeting held at Sudbury on Monday the seventh day of April A. D. 1845 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz.

1<sup>st</sup> Chose John Hunt Moderator

2<sup>d</sup> Chose town officer not chosen at March meeting viz.

Surveyors of Lumber - Charles Fisher, G. W. Gates, Ephraim Moore

Pound Keeper - Jonas Tower

Measurers of Wood - Nahum Thompson, Charles Fisher, Charles Moore

School Committee - Martin Goodnow - It was then voted that

the school committee be the examining and prudential committee.

excused Cyrus Taylor from serving as Highway surveyor and chose

Israel S. Brown - voted to pass this article for the present.

3<sup>d</sup> Voted to Grant the sum of one thousand dollars to repair Highways town ways and Bridges the present year that the price of Labor be twelve and a half cents per hour - then voted that each surveyor shall have a warrant and that they be collectors.

Voted to take up the 9<sup>th</sup> article

9<sup>th</sup> Voted to except of the following Reports viz.

Report of the committee chosen to superintend the building of the Poor house

Report of the Selectmen in laying <sup>out</sup> a Road on petition of Sewel Hunt and others.

Report of the School Committee.

Report of the Committee on accounts - then voted that the following accounts be allowed viz. Jona. Bacons \$3. Aaron Hunts \$1.50 Wm Brigham \$5. Reuben Haynes \$10.

Voted to take up the 2<sup>d</sup> article

Chose Timothy Johnson Constable and collector who agrees to collect the taxes for one per ct, and do all other business usually done by the Constable free of expence to the town.

4<sup>th</sup> Voted to Grant two hundred and fifty dollars for the support of the Poor.

Voted to Grant one thousand seventy six dollars  $\frac{67}{100}$  to pay for Poor house.

5<sup>th</sup> Voted to Grant the same sum for School and Fuel as was granted last year and that it be expended in the same manner.
